

## *Who is Like Our God and King?*

August 17: Isaiah 43-44

### Scripture Memory (Isaiah 43:11-13)

- <sup>11</sup> **I, even I, am the Lord, and apart from me there is no savior.**  
<sup>12</sup> **I have revealed and saved and proclaimed— I, and not some foreign god among you. You are my witnesses,” declares the Lord, “that I am God.**  
<sup>13</sup> **Yes, and from ancient days I am he. No one can deliver out of my hand. When I act, who can reverse it?” (Isaiah 43:11-13)**

- I. **Revealed:** God sets forth His plan.
  - A. The critics can't believe that God can foretell and bring to pass future events.
  - B. God is different from man-made gods and philosophies. He alone can save.
  
- II. **Saved:** Fear is replaced with the comfort of God's presence and purpose.
  - A. God has redeemed us.
  - B. God loves us.
  - C. We are created for God's glory.
  
- III. **Proclaimed:** There is no other Savior and God.
  - A. The case against the idols.
  - B. The evidence put on the table.
  - C. The proclamation made.
  
- IV. **The Servant of the Lord:** He will bring justice and salvation to the ends of the earth.
  - A. Cyrus
  - B. Israel
  - C. Jesus Christ

The entire plan of God can be summarized in God's revelation, God's salvation, and God's proclamation. Each one of these is for God's glory and centers on the Servant of the Lord, Jesus Christ. Through Jesus Christ, we too are revealing God's plan of salvation in our lives as we proclaim His Son through the power of the Holy Spirit. When we proclaim the deeds of God, we should remember that our salvation is not because of who we are but because of what God has done. It is not because of what we've done but because of who God is.
